Then we will add another \$1000. Becky made a motion to contribute the \$4000 to the upgrade of the Lindeman bldg and George seconded it. Motion passed.

INSURANCE; We had a small discussion on insurance and decided we needed more info. Rose will look into getting an agent to come talk to the club and answer our questions.

Mike Farmer has resigned from the Board and we will be replacing him. Be thinking about who you think will make a good replacement.

Floyd Wilson inquired about selling track pads. Kent said we need to make adjustments and see if we will get orders first.

Becky gave a report on grant finding and how it is going.

Alan Geho will be in charge of the spring opening at the museum. He would like the club to plow the wheat field before April 6. Carol made a motion to accept the job and Floyd seconded it. Motion passed.

It was suggested that we order more Lindeman belt buckles to replace the ones lost and sell them as a fund raiser. Floyd made a motion to buy the buckles and George seconded it. Motion passed. It will be looked into.

Rob made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Kent seconded it. Motion passed.
