The president called the meeting to order.

Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting. Rob corrected the color of the material for the plaques as black on yellow not yellow on black. Kent made a motion to accept the minutes as read with corrections and George seconded. Motion passed.

Rob reported \$13,168.63 with the interest on the CD at \$22,000. \$791.82 was used on the fixing up of the Lindeman Bldg. George made a motion to accept the treasurer's report and Kent seconded it. Motion passed.

Steve Tippet sent in his letter of resignation to the board members. Kent nominated Andy Freepoms to take Steve's place on the board. Rose nominated John Kobli. Voting was by secret ballot, Andy received the most votes and will resume Steve's place on the board.

LINDEMAN BLDG: John described the work that is being done along with the raising of the John Deere sign and other signs. The mural on the side of the bldg is being refreshed and repainted.

PLAQUES: It was suggested that we buy the material to make the plaques and Rob will find out where. Kaz Trophies said it will be \$7 a plaque at his business.

INSURANCE: Rose found a company that would cover the tractor runs and since the tractor run to Zillah was ready to go, she paid for the insurance. Rob said the club would reimburse her. Rob made a motion to go ahead and George seconded it. Motion passed. Phill Scott is the contact person.

DONATION OF EQUIPMENT: This will be handled the same as it has been through the joint accession committee.

After several long commentaries from members and visitors Kent made a motion to re-

move Rose from the office of President and Floyd seconded it. A secret ballot was held which showed that Rose would no longer be President.

Rose made a motion to remove Kent from the office of Vice President and a secret ballot was held that showed Kent will remain Vice President.

MEETINGS: The question was asked where to hold meetings and Rose suggested we keep it at the museum which did not pass. Clay suggested the American Legend Post 36 and Greg seconded it. Motion passed. Next meeting will be July 20, 2024 and the following one will be Oct 19, 2024.

Kent said he was uncomfortable having the Central Washington agricultural museum vice president in charge of the Lindeman Building and asked if anyone wanted to make a motion about that but the motion died.

Nick made a motion to adjourn the meeting and George seconded it. Motion passed.

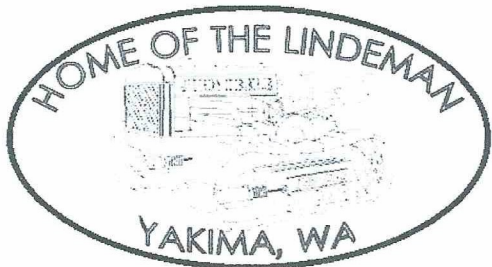
